I heard the number of those who had been marked with the seal, one hundred and forty-four thousand marked from every tribe of the children of Israel.

They stood before the throne and before the Lamb, wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation comes from our God, who is seated on the throne, and from the Lamb." ### **TODAY, NOV 1 IS THE FEAST OF ALL SAINTS.**

"There was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands." Today's first reading from the 7th chapter of Revelation, describes the reason for our glorious rejoicing today. Agnes and Maria Goretti were only 12 when they were martyred; Anthony of the Desert died at 105. God's saints come in every size, shape, color and age, and have one great thing in common: During their lives all helped to announce the dominion of God. The idea of holding one feast to celebrate all holy women and men seems to have been born in early Christianity. In the Byzantine rite, All Saints Day is celebrated on the first SUN after Pentecost. In the Latin rite Pope Gregory IV set NOV 1 as the date for a festival for all the saints. All Saints Day is a celebration perfectly suited to autumn, the end of the agricultural year, when we celebrate God's great harvest of all people who have shown love, joy and service to others. That's why All Saints and its holy eve, Halloween, are made bright with autumn fruits, vegetables and flowers. In about the 10th century the first canonizations took place. These were official statements by the pope that someone was clearly a saint. For the past several centuries the process of canonization has been a very thorough procedure involving years of investigation and reflection. The number of canonized saints is relatively small. And yet the martyrology, the list of the saints, includes over 10,000 names! But today is more than just a remembrance of good people. Today we rejoice in the communion of saints. We're part of this communion. All creation is united in the Spirit. We look forward to the day of resurrection, when creation will be transformed. Perhaps our celebration actually hastens that great day.



## **MON, NOV 2 IS THE COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED: ALL SOULS.**

This is the day we set aside to pray for all the dead who have gone before us. Christians dead and living are all one body. Our love and work on earth can be a blessing to those who have died, just as their love is a blessing for the living. In some places cemeteries are filled with burning candles. Many families remember the dead each year by giving alms to the poor, by planting a tree or by donating to a hospital. In some places families have a picnic in the graveyard. Extra portions of food are set aside for the dead to share. In Latin America the Day of the Dead is

not gloomy or sad. It is filled with life. Vendors sell candies in the shapes of skulls, skeletons and coffins. People make little figures of skeletons going about day-to-day activities. Long ago in England, people went door-to-door on this day and begged for "soul cakes". This may be how trick-or-treating began. All Souls' Day can be spent telling sorties of the dead. Photo albums, scrapbooks and anything that helps spark memories are all part of the celebration. For many Christians in Mediterranean lands, the dead arrive with gifts on All Souls' Day. Children especially receive treats so that they're happy to be visited by the dead.

Many Christians set up shrines for the dead. The aromas of chrysanthemums and marigolds and fragrant herbs are said to assist the memory. All Souls' reminds us that it is good to speak of the dead, to remember, and to pray. The Church continues the remembrance throughout the month of NOV into Advent. The growing darkness can remind us of the end of days when time will be no more. At this season we ask God to speed up the coming of the kingdom, where justice will flower, where life will be lived in all its fullness, where death itself will die.



I John 3:1-3  
NOT REALLY PLACE,  
NOT REALLY TIME



We believe in life after death, but we cannot put into words what it will be like. Every time we try, our descriptions come up short.

If we say, "It will be a special place," we use an inaccurate word: place. Heaven will be more than a place. It is not a place like a planet or star, for that would make it finite. It is infinite, not located.

If we say, "It will be a special time," we use an inaccurate word: time. God lies beyond all time. Time has limits, but God is infinite.

Eternal life lies beyond what we can describe. Even St. John struggled with the right words: "We are God's child-

ren now; what we shall be has not yet been revealed. We do know that when it is revealed we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is."

John chose other descriptive words like "children" and "being like God." In eternity we will have a special relationship with our creator. It will be wonderful, but it is hard to describe it more.

Today is All Saints Day. We celebrate all the saints who have passed beyond the doors of death and have become more than God's children. They are like the God they see.

We learn from their example in life. We aim to share their glory in heaven. That is the inheritance of the children of God.

Every 4th year on this day in the US, people choose their next president. Every 2nd year, some senators and members of the House of Representatives are chosen. Many local elections are held on this day too. In colonial times only about 15% of the American people had the right to cast a ballot. At first, suffrage (the right to vote) was limited to free males, age 21 and over, who owned land. In some colonies, Catholics and Jews were not allowed to vote. Many years passed before women and African Americans were granted suffrage. In some states it was 1948 before Native Americans were given that right, and in 1970 suffrage was granted to those between the ages of 18 and 21.

Please remember to exercise your right to vote this TUE, NOV 3. Appreciate the rights and freedoms we have in our country. May God continue to bless America.


