

# GOSPEL: MATTHEW 20:1-16A

lesus told his disciples this parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out at dawn to hire laborers for his vineyard. After agreeing with them for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard. Going out about nine o'clock, the landowner saw others standing idle in the marketplace, and he said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard, and I will give you what is just.' So they went off. And he went out again around noon, and around three o'clock, and did likewise. Going out about five o'clock, the landowner found others standing around, and said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' They answered, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard.' When it was evening the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Summon the laborers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and ending with the first.' When those who had started about five o'clock came, each received the usual daily wage. So when the first came, they thought that they would receive more, but each of them also got the usual wage. And on receiving it they grumbled against the landowner, saying, 'These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made

them equal to us, who bore the day's burden and the heat.' He said to one of them in reply, 'My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?' Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last."

TODAY, SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 19th MARKS THE 125th ANNIVER-SARY OF THE FOUNDING OF ST. JOHN THE EVANGELIST PARISH IN CONNELLSVILLE, PENNSYLVANIA. Bishop Phelan of the Pittsburgh Diocese appointed Fr. Raymond Wider as the first pastor of St. John's and he made the first entry, verifying this date. Slovak and other ethnic groups including Poles, Hungarians, Croa-



tians, Lithuanians, Czechs and Italians from within a radius of 20 miles registered and became members of the first parish community. The present church building was completed in 1899 at an approximate cost of \$14,000, and included 3 bells, a pipe organ and a seating capacity of 533 persons.

So many parishioners and friends have journeyed through our doors to pray, to learn, or to party, that we could never give a count of all those whose faith was enriched by the presence of this parish. A few people of sturdy stock and faith began with pride, one hundred and twenty-five years ago, what you and I call our spiritual home on earth.

It is quite a milestone that we have achieved and we are celebrating it today with a Mass and a reception. We welcome the Dean and former priests who have served our parish over the years to celebrate with us.

Today we celebrate our Catholic heritage with prayer, hospitality, reverence, congeniality and friendship, that have become synonymous with our parish of St. John the Evangelist.

Together let us enjoy one another's presence and company as we strive to better the St. John family in our hearts, and as we pray together for our past, present and future. Congratulations to us for being the firm recipients of a firm Catholic foundation which we lovingly and faithfully pass on to the future Catholics of our area.

# SUN, SEP 20, 2020 25th SUN IN ORDINARY TIME Isaiah 55:6-9 TRUST IN GOD'S WISDOM

It is hard to figure God out. Looking around creation we see beautiful places but also areas of devastation. We meet charitable people but also others who are unkind. We see homes of the rich and the streets of the homeless. One family prospers. Another suffers multiple tragedies. What was God thinking by creating such inequality?

Our own lives are also filled with blessing and sorrow. Momentary incidents have forever shaped us. Friends have rescued us. Death stalks us. It is hard to figure out what God has in mind. God spoke to Isaiah, "My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways." You can say that again. As hard as it is to read the mind of God, God does not choose to act the way we think a divine, loving Being should.

Through the prophet, God does not apologize for the way things are. Instead, God simply tells us we will never quite figure it out. The best we can do is turn to God for mercy.

To accept the wisdom of God requires faith and humble admission of our own inability to fully probe God's plan. It also takes trust that God will ultimately bring about the good that awaits all creation.
