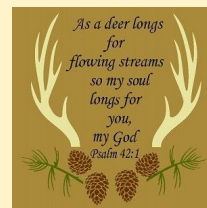

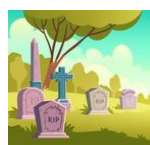

**We celebrate the Birth of the Virgin Mary this TUE, SEP 8.**



No word of Mary's birth is recorded in scripture, but it is fitting that we honor her birth in the harvest season, because Mary is the model for all who wish to bring forth Christ in their lives. In some parts of Europe, the summer harvest and the seed for the winter crops are blessed today. For centuries, Catholic growers have used this day to bring the grape harvest to Church to be blessed. Alpine farmers drive their cattle and sheep down from summer pastures today. Mary's birth was first kept by Byzantine Christians. By the 7th century the Roman Church began celebrating this feast too. Like other feasts of Mary, it was a day for processions. We don't know who Mary's parents were. Tradition has named them Ann and Joachim. During the 5th century, a famous church named for St. Ann was dedicated in Jerusalem on SEP 8. The Church was said to be built on the site of the house where Mary was born.



**I am happy to share with you the financial results of St. Rita's "Festival-to-Go", which was held in JUL.**

The total income from our 3 evenings of "drive-thru" food service was \$92,849, which came from food sales, the 50/50 drawing, donations and sponsorships.

Total expenses for the fundraiser were \$27,691.89, which includes food

expense, tickets, set-up, advertising and security.

The profit, which will help our St. Rita parish significantly, was \$65,157.11.

### 23RD SUN IN ORDINARY TIME

#### Romans 13:8-10

#### LAYING DOWN THE LAW

As institutions age, their laws multiply. As countries grow older, the laws of nation, state, and city grow ever more complex. It is hard to know them all. We hire lawyers to study laws for us.

The laws of the church are also complex. They are collected in the Code of Canon Law, which is also hard to absorb. We need church lawyers to help us out. New laws are written all the time. Old ones are adjusted. The code grows slowly outdated as new legislation forms. Everyone wants to be a good citizen and a good Catholic, but it is hard sometimes to know what the law is.

In Jesus' day, the law was also complex. At times it appeared that laws conflicted, as when he healed on a Sabbath. Laws of charity conflicted with laws governing sacred time.

When they asked Jesus for the greatest law, he simplified the complex structure of laws and reduced them to two: Love God. Love your neighbor.

St. Paul told the Romans, "The one who loves another has fulfilled the law." He made it very simple. God is the ultimate judge over how we observe the laws of church and state. God made the rules as simple as possible. When the laws of our institutions seem complex, we can always please God by following the most basic law of all: love.
