### Ephesians 4:1-6 NOT GETTING ALONG

Fighting can become the status quo. When kids fight at school, someone tries to break it up, but in the end we know they're just kids. Fighting is what kids do. During an election year the mudslinging can get intense. There will be a few calls for civility, but most of us shrug our shoulders. There's nothing we can do. Fighting is what candidates do. Teens and their parents, parents and teachers, contributors to blogs, sometimes even pastors and council members - some groups seem to disagree by their nature. It isn't right, but fighting can become the status quo.

The members of the early church had the same problem. Many New Testament letters indicate that the

first Christians believed in Christ, held high ideals, and lived in community - but they didn't always get along.

In one passage from the Letter to the Ephesians, you can just imagine the spats that provoked these words: "I urge you to live in a manner worthy of the call you have received, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love, striving to preserve the unity of the spirit through the bond of peace." The readers had to be urged toward those virtues because they were not very evident.

Fighting should never be the status quo. We have a more noble vision of community life. Our one Lord, one faith, and one baptism summon us to be one body and one spirit.

The RCIA participants and often their sponsors come to weekly informational gatherings to learn and discuss the fundamentals of the Catholic Faith - God, the Bible, Mary and the Saints, the Mass, the Sacraments, the Moral Life, Church History, but most importantly of all - Who is Jesus? Our mission in the RCIA is to help make present in the life of each and every participant in the RCIA the life, mission, teaching, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, and to bring each person who comes to us into a living relationship with him.

The sessions are not "convert classes". They are informal gatherings, led by trained facilitators who are your fellow parishioners, who help the candidates and catechumens to learn the things that will help them to become more informed about the Catholic Church and what it will mean for them as they discern their choice to enter into full communion

with us; but they also have the opportunity to form bonds of friendship, trust and community with each other as they discuss and sometimes challenge the things that they have heard.



Conversion is not always an easy process. It requires us to look inside ourselves, to examine who we are before God. In the Gospels, an encounter with Jesus always involves an honest, unflinching gaze into the eyes of truth and then to respond to his call to follow him. Those who are making this journey have answered that call and are now on the path of learning and discerning.

HATE IN OUR NATION: The most basic prayer of Judaism is known as the Shema, after the first word of Deuteronomy 6:4 "Sh'ma Yisrael Adonai Eloheinu Adonai Echad/Hear O Israel: The LORD is our God, the LORD alone." Even though the full prayer continues with the succeeding verses ("Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength ...") the first line is oft prayed by itself, summing up as it does the fundamental tenet of the lewish faith. And undoubtedly those words were on the lips of many gathered in the Tree of Life Synagogue as shots rang out that terrible morning of 27 October.



The fact that a mere week after the most horrific act of anti-Semitic violence in our nation's history, per-

petrated less than 50 miles from the lewel, the Sunday readings repeated the Shema twice was a "coincidence" too powerful to ignore. Thus I was inspired to preach on the **HATE** that led to this tragedy, a **HATE** that is producing more and more violence, a **HATE** that is ripping our nation apart. I wish I could have preached at all seven Masses, as I felt that the words the Lord had put in my mouth needed to be heard by the entire community. Please understand that here I am not

using the image of words being "put" in my mouth as a mere That Saturday morning, in my

Blessed Sacrament, I listened to the Lord to give me the words I should preach. And literally, as soon as that prayer escaped my lips, the homily started to take shape in my mind. I FIRMLY believe that anything good that I say comes NOT from me but from the Holy Spirit. Conversely, when I stand "in the pulpit" and make no sense or sound stupid it is because I have foolishly IGNORED the Spirit's promptings and chosen MY words instead.

There is an old saw that the preacher is first and foremost preaching to himself. This homily was certainly NO exception. ALL of us are in one way or another guilty of fanning the flames of hatred by feeding into the us vs. them mentality. ALL of us me included! - need to examine our consciences.
