

Providing for the safety and welfare of the faithful has necessitated many modifications to our ritual practices.




To reduce the risk of transmitting the coronavirus, it is not permitted this year to "sign" the faithful with ashes in the customary fashion. Rather, on Ash Wednesday the tradition of being marked with ashes will take place in a different fashion, through a Sprinkling with Ashes.

Sprinkling with Ashes is a custom observed in many countries throughout the world. The minister, using their thumb and index finger, secures a pinch of ashes from the vessel containing the ashes. Without using words, the minister then sprinkles these ashes on the heads of the recipients.

Through this ancient practice we witness to our intention to undertake penitential practices during these Lenten days. We join with the whole Church throughout the world in acknowledging our need for continuing conversion. We express our hope and firm conviction that through Christ's victory over sin and death our tears shall one day be turned to rejoicing.



I CONFESS. One form of the penitential rite at the beginning of Mass is the traditional Confiteor, or "I confess," a prayer that was formerly prayed by the priest alone at the foot of the altar, but which is now prayed by the entire assembly. The Confiteor is at once personal - "I confess" - and communal, prayed aloud, together. We recognize that sin does not just separate us from God; sin comes between us and others, isolating us. We acknowledge that sin has many dimensions, individual and communal: sins of thought, sins of speech, sins of action, sins of omission. Sin is not something that happens to us; sin is something we do. In the Confiteor, we take responsibility for our own actions. The repeated insistence on our "fault," with the ritual gesture of striking the breast, an ancient sign of penitence, is not meant to lower our self-esteem. Rather, it acknowledges our human instinct to transfer the blame whenever we can ("The devil made me do it!"). This prayer stops us short. We take responsibility for ourselves, our actions, our failure to act. Then we cry out to God in those ancient words, Kyrie, eleison - Lord, have mercy. For the sinner who repents, there is mercy. This truth is at the heart of our faith, and it is where the Mass, our feast of faith, begins.

FALSE PROPHETS, TRUE PROPHETS. In Deuteronomy today we hear that God's very words will fill the mouth of a true prophet, but a false prophet will, in a manner of speaking, put mere mortal words into God's mouth. In Mark's Gospel, we see Jesus teaching and healing as a true prophet, filled with the authority of God's own voice, the Holy One of God. The whole history of our church is filled with both true and false prophets. But in today's Gospel we learn that Jesus' fame spread because he taught with authority. We also learn from his desert temptation confrontations with Satan, that anyone can quote scripture, even against God's purposes. Jesus' authority was not like that of the scribes, who held the official positions of religious authority in his day. Our work is to do our best to discern the true prophets in our midst, and to be true prophets as well. The psalmist tells us how to do this: by not hardening our hearts when God speaks. If we truly listen to God, it will be God's very words filling our mouths.

TUE, FEB 2 is the Feast of the PRESENTATION OF THE LORD OR CANDLEMAS DAY.

It is 40 days after Christmas. In many places the nativity scene is left up until then. On this day it is decorated with the first flowers of spring before it is taken down and put away.

We celebrate a joyful event told in the 2nd chapter of Luke. When Jesus was 40 days old, Mary and Joseph took Him to the Temple of Jerusalem to present Him to the Lord. In the Temple, lesus was recognized by Anna and Simeon, 2 elderly people of great holiness. They were filled with joy. Simeon took Jesus in his arms. Old

age embraced youth. Simeon spoke a beautiful prayer. Now that he saw the Messiah, he could die in peace. Simeon also spoke of the sadness to come, which would pierce the heart of Mary.

Someone called Jesus "a light to the nations". The light of His presence in the world has been celebrated on this day for many centuries.



Traditionally on this feast day enough candles were blessed to last all year.

That's why it is commonly called "Candlemas". It is a feast of light. At church everyone joins in singing Simeon's song. In some parishes, the people light the candles and carry them all around the church and even out into the streets. We can carry the light of Christ to every corner of the world.

We will also bless candles at our Masses and anyone wishing to have blessed candles for home may purchase them after Mass for a donation of \$3. Blessed candles in our churches and homes signify the living presence of Christ among us. With Christ as our light, we warm a lost and wintry world.

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR CONSECRATED LIFE - TUE, FEB 2.

In 1997 Pope John Paul II instituted a day of prayer for women and men in consecrated life. This celebration is attached to the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on FEB 2. This feast is also known as Candlemas Day, the day on which candles are blessed, symbolizing Christ who is the Light of the world. So too, those in consecrated life are called to reflect the light of Jesus Christ to all peoples. This celebration of World Day for Consecrated Life is

transferred to the following SUN in order to highlight the gift of consecrated persons for the whole Church. World Day for Consecrated Life will be celebrated in the Church on TUE, FEB 2, and in parishes on the weekend of FEB 6-7. Please pray for all those who have made commitments to the consecrated life, and be sure to thank them on their special day. May they continue to be inspired by Jesus Christ and respond generously to God's gift of their vocation.



WED, FEB 3 IS THE FEAST OF ST. BLAISE, BISHOP/MARTYR

Blaise was a bishop of Sebaste in Armenia. He was martyred dur-

ing the persecution of Christians by the Roman emperor, Lucinius. Blaise is said to have been a physician, as well as a bishop.

Legend tells us that Blaise saved the life of a boy who was choking on a

fish bone. He is now the patron saint of all who have diseases of the throat.

On his feast day in many US parishes, people have their throats blessed. It's no surprise that this custom coincides with the peak of the sore throat and flu season. Before the discovery of penicillin, a person could die from complications of a sore throat.

A tradition of blessing throats began at a time when the church's calendar was filled with blessings for the saints' days. Many of these are no longer practiced, but the custom of blessing the throats remains. Two candles are tied in the shape of a cross and then are touched to one's neck. We can think of the blessing of our throats as a sign of God's care for every part of us.

Deuteronomy 18:15-20 GOD'S INTERPRETER

God speaks to us in different ways because we do not always listen the same. We experience God in our communion

at church, in the simplicity of nature, in the Sacred Scriptures, and in the counsel of the wise. But God often uses another person to bring a message to us, because we cannot hear it on our own.

During their exodus from Egypt, the chosen people heard the words of God through Moses. They liked it that way. They thought if they heard God's Word directly they would die. They needed an intermediary to shield

them from the awesome power of God's presence.

God loved them and wanted them to hear the sacred words of the covenant. So God used Moses, and they listened to him.

God did even more for these people. God promised to give them another prophet from among their kin. God knew that in later generations we would have the same problem. We do not always listen to God the same. We need someone to help us interpret.

In the fullness of time, God raised up a prophet like Moses. Jesus sits at God's right hand and intercedes for us. Human and divine, Jesus helps us hear God's Word.

Our diocese participates in the COLLECTION FOR THE CHURCH IN CENTRAL/EASTERN EUROPE each year. This year the collection will be taken up at all Masses on FEB 6-7. This collection helps the Church bring light to the nations of Central/Eastern Europe as they rebuild after more than 70 years of Soviet rule.

The worldwide coronavirus outbreak restricted nonessential travel across the globe. Stay-at-home orders, physical distancing and quarantine practices revealed great and urgent needs, especially in those countries of Eastern Europe still in turbulent transition stages. There, weak economies were made more vulnerable. In Ukraine, the Greek Catholic Church came to the assistance of homebound senior citizens in many cities, using church facilities to organize the work, and engaging both local volunteers and assistance from abroad. In addition about 120 hospital chaplains collected and distributed masks, protective clothing, sanitizer, etc. as they ministered to the sick throughout the country.

Our participation in the COLLECTION FOR THE CHURCH IN CENTRAL/EASTERN EUROPE expresses our care and support throughout the region especially in times of crisis and disruption. We are called to offer hope to our fellow Catholics by providing both material and spiritual assistance. Please ask God to strengthen those who serve, and to relieve those who suffer.
