

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM:** Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved.


#### SECOND READING: I CORINTHIANS 1:3-9



## THIS WED, DEC 6 IS THE FEAST DAY OF ST. NICHOLAS.

Nicholas may be the most popular saint of all time. Numerous churches are named after him. He seems to be portrayed by artists more than any other saint, with the exception of Mary.

Nicholas was the bishop of the city of Myra in Asia Minor, now the nation of Turkey. Centuries after he died, his bones were brought to the city of Bari in Italy. People came to his tomb to pray and many were healed of their illnesses.

According to a legend, when Nicholas

was a baby and his parents brought him to church to be baptized, he jumped eagerly into the water. When he grew up and was named bishop, he became known as the "wonder maker". He could heal the sick and calm storms.

A story is told about a man who was so poor that he could no longer buy food for his family. He was going to sell his daughters into slavery so they would not starve. Bishop Nicholas found out about this, so at night he tossed three bags of gold into their house through a window.

In many places, families are visited today by someone dressed up like

St. Nicholas. His visit is usually scary. He is accompanied by a devil, who snorts and groans and rattles chains. Bishop Nicholas tells each person in the family about the



things they do wrong, and encourages them to do better in the coming year. When he leaves, there is a feast, with tangerines as reminders of the gold he gave to help the poor women.

Candy canes remind us of his crosier, the shepherd's staff that bishops carry.





## SOMETHING NEW "A NEW COVENANT"

The Bible includes both an Old Testament and a New Testament. "Testament" refers to the covenant God makes with us, the way God

relates to us. During Advent, in church services, you will hear scripture readings coming from both Old and New Testaments, because both are important. Actually, the New Testament focuses on the nature of God in a way that makes the whole message better understood.

This is far different from old and new clothes. Hanging in our closets, old clothes tend to move toward the back and are little used. One in awhile, however, we look back and rediscover something we really liked and we put it on again. The Old Testament contains treasures that need to be seen and valued. Unlike clothing, it never goes out of style. The message it proclaims is always relevant to our present life.

The New Testament, though, makes God more real for us by revealing God's nature in a personal way, in an actual person, born in Bethlehem, and still living in our hearts and minds.

Perhaps the reason that Advent is so important is that it gives us time to think about what His coming means. We are enabled to have within our lives a new and closer relationship with the eternal God. We can use Advent for understanding God's nature more fully. We can experience God not as far off but near. We can see God's laws and commandments not so much as something "demanded" of us but as something "offered" to help and guide us. Hearing the message of both testaments, we can see God's love in both the shepherd of the 23rd Psalm and in the one, who so loved the world, as to give his only Son for us.

Advent can be a rich experience, if we can see ourselves in the light of both covenants, letting the new covenant help us discover God's love afresh in our hearts. What a Christmas gift it would be if God's love could be born within us in a new and deeply personal way! Let's pray that this will happen!

As parishes we should Prepare the Way of the Lord with random acts of kindness allowing them to symbolize the straw that was used as bedding in the manger, where the Christ Child was placed by His Mother Mary on that first Christmas.

Every kind act, no matter how small, is like a pebble tossed into the pond of human caring; the rings reach out far beyond the point of impact; the action of our kind deeds impacts the people around us, those people act more kindly toward the people around *them*, and so it goes, on and on. This will allow others, family, friends and strangers, to open their hearts to the Christ Child.

In today's bulletin is a special flyer. This page is a set of cards that says you performed an act of kindness in honor of the coming of the Messiah. Please cut these cards apart as you do any acts of kindness; write on the back of the card in a short phrase, the act you performed, then bring the cards to church and put them in the manger in the sanctuary. In this way we make the bedding for the Christ Child with our good labors and openness of our hearts.

Each adult and child can participate in the "bedding" of the mangers in our churches and our hearts. There will be extra sheets available in the back of the churches. It would be a great tribute to our parishes' love of our Savior by making sure the mangers are filled with our acts of kindness during Advent, as we prepare the Way of the Lord.

#### THE ADVENT WREATH: ITS SYMBOLS, ITS MEANINGS

- The wreath, a circle, expresses God's unending eternity.
- Evergreen symbolizes God's unchangeableness and our immortality.
- ◆ 4 candles, I for each week of Advent, represent the many hundreds of years people awaited the Redeemer.
- ♦ Violet candles and ribbon remind us of longing expectation.
- The rose candle symbolizes joy and hope in awaiting the birth of Jesus.
- Red ribbon stands for Jesus' blood, shed on the cross.

# DEC 3, 2023 IST SUN OF ADVENT WATCH OUT!

In Advent, we celebrate our hope that the Lord might come more fully into our lives. The first reading from Isaiah voices the hope of sinners for a redeemer. As sinners, we too hope for forgiveness. Unlike Isaiah, we know that God has come to bring us back, when the Father sent his Son, Jesus, to save us. And God's power was manifest in the raising of Christ from the dead. Our faith in Jesus leads us to a new way of looking at the world. We can see what God is doing as well as remembering what God has done.

The Gospel reminds us to look constantly for signs of God's work. Jesus says simply, "Watch!" Like the gate-keepers in Jesus' short parable, we need to keep our eyes open for him. Just as we expect people driving cars to turn off their cell phones and keep their eyes on the road, so we can stop looking for whatever makes us comfortable and watch for ways to love others as God loves us.

When we only look out for ourselves, we may miss the signs of God's presence around us. Instead of looking at the difficulties of life as obstacles, we can watch for them as opportunities to stretch our faith, to rely on God, or to show God's love to a friend.

The Corinthians were also watching for the Lord to come. Paul encourages them (and us) by his reminder that we "are not lacking in any spiritual gift" (I Corinthians I:7). The Holy Spirit gives us all we need to help each other prepare for the Lord's coming. They were thinking of Jesus as coming in glory. Though we don't see the full glory of the Lord, part of that glory is his presence in the sacraments. In them we celebrate not just the coming of the Lord, but his working in the world. He shares his life with us in baptism, gives us his Spirit in confirmation and himself in the Eucharist, heals us in reconciliation and the anointing of the sick, and calls us to make him present to others in holy orders and matrimony. You could almost say his second coming is taking place now. Watch for it. ~Tom Schmidt
