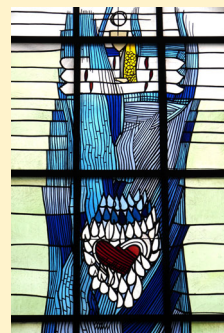

OCTOBER is the Month of the Rosary.

The rosary is a liturgical devotion, consisting of the recitation of 1 Our Father, 10 Hail Marys, and a Glory Be to the Father, for each of the 20 decades, dedicated to 20 Scriptural Mysteries as the topic of mental prayer, which is the primary focus of this devotion. Separated into 4 sets of Five Mysteries, as they are called, actually meditations - Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful and Glorious - the rosary focuses on the Incarnation, the Mission, the Sufferings and the Glorification of Jesus. It is often called the Marian Psalter since the Hail Mary is repeated

150 times instead of each of the 150 Psalms. This devotion has been highly recommended by the Church, with many of the popes praising it as a fine prayer to develop a true Christological devotion, specifically because the Mysteries have their inspiration from biblical and liturgical themes. Indulgences have been attached to its recitations, and it certainly seems to fit the definition of the popular devotions spoken of in the Constitution of the Sacred Liturgy and leads people to it. We should appreciate the fact that the rosary is a practice of piety that easily harmonizes with the liturgy.

SUN, OCT 4 IS THE FEAST DAY OF ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI. The church of Francis' day was wealthy and powerful, and most people did not have the courage to take the words of the gospels literally. But Francis followed Christ's example. He became the "Poverella" -the "little poor one". He owned only one tunic, a plain brown robe with a rope belt, which was the garment worn by peasants when they labored in the fields. He worked with lepers, the most despised people of society. He acted as a peacemaker between warring towns. Soon others began to join Francis, earning their bread by working in the fields or by doing odd jobs. Francis had an understanding of the unity of all creation that was way ahead of its time. He addressed every created thing as a brother or sister and treated everything with reverence. He allowed the beauty of creation to fill him with joy.



Francis became ill and died when he was only 45 years old. On his deathbed he composed the Canticle of the Sun, a hymn of praise still sung to this day. Then he asked to be laid naked on Brother Earth so that he could become Sister Death as simply as possible. The pope who canonized him two years later described him as "the most perfect image of Christ". His body rests in the basilica that was built at Assisi after his death.

Francis of Assisi is a patron saint of Italy. In 1979 he was also named patron saint of ecologists and all people who work to protect the environment.

In keeping with the tradition of the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi, the 9am Mass at St. Aloysius will be celebrated outside by the St. Padre Pio Shrine. Parishioners are asked to bring their own chairs.

Also, we will have a Blessing of Animals at 10:15am (after the Mass), also at the Shrine. Parishioners from all 4 of our parishes and friends are invited to bring their pets and other animals to this blessing service.

In case of inclement weather the Mass will be in the church, and blessing of animals in the social hall.

We gather to ask St. Francis' intercession on our pets and their owners.

Philippians 2:1-11
HAVING ATTITUDE

Unity brings strength.

Unity is the goal of any community, whether it be family, church, business, or nation. Group members who enjoy one another's company appeal to newcomers. These groups succeed. They move toward their goal. They breed excitement. They are strong. St. Paul wished that kind of unity for the Philippians. He knew what would make them strong. He wished them to have the same mind and the same love. He wanted them thinking about one thing: "Have in you the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus."

The attitude of Jesus was service. Jesus humbly regarded others more than himself by offering his life on the

cross. He looked out not for his own interests but for those of others. He did not demand that the cup of suffering pass by him. He accepted sorrow so that others might experience joy.

Groups unite because of another trait that may not be evident: humility. Each member serves the needs of the entire group. Each person looks out for the good of the whole, not just for their own sakes. It may look like good groups are simply having fun, but they also endure hardship. Each individual has the attitude of Christ, and that is what makes groups united and strong.

Some people wish they belonged to a united group. Others make their group united by contributing the strength of humble service.
