Amos 6:1a, 4-7 RICH AND POOR

The gap between rich and poor is uncomfortably large. If you can read, you already have advantages over many other people in the world. If you worship in a church building and have printed copies of bulletins and worship aids, you have resources far beyond those of many others.

Most people are unaware of their privileges. They do not live in the squalor of poverty. They forget it is there, except in photographs and letters of appeal. They see the gap between themselves and those who are richer, but they ignore the gap between themselves and the poor.

The prophet Amos had no patience with the rich. They lived a comfortable life: They lay on beds

of ivory. They ate meat. They played music. They drank wine by the bowlful. They anointed themselves with the best oils and perfumes. They had it all and used it all. They showed little concern for the poor.

Amos could envision another society, a society in which the rich shared. Those with more resources have more responsibility to help those who have less.

The rich who thought they had it all lost it all in the exile. When Jerusalem was taken into captivity, invaders took interest in the booty of the rich. The poor had nothing. They had nothing to lose. But the rich lost it all.

Our possessions hold us captive to our desires, to our fears, and to ourselves. Freedom is in giving, not in possessing.

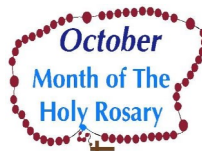

I find it funny how easily misquotes can happen. For example, did you know that Darth Vader doesn't actually say "Luke, I am your father"? He actually says "No, I am

your father." Don't believe me? It's true.

I'm here to talk about another misquote. St. Paul in his letter to Timothy is quoted as saying *money is the root of all evil*. But this is actually not what he says. He says, *the love of money is the root of all evil* (1 Tm 6:10). This makes sense because we know that, when used well, money can be a source of goodness and a genuine expression for love of neighbor.

I am about to break one of the rules of pastorship in deciding to talk about money here. In the Official Handbook for Pastors that I oddly found under my pillow the morning after being named administrator, Rule #62 states: *Thou shalt not speaketh about money in thine second bulletin column*. But we have a number of special collections coming up whose causes are near and dear to my heart so I feel inspired to break the rules and just go for it. I want you to know where your money is going so that you can be confident that your giving is a source of goodness.

CLERGY AND SEMINARIAN ASSISTANCE

It's hard to believe that just seven years ago, I embarked on my first journey up to Erie, PA preparing to enter St. Mark Seminary for the first time. The last seven years have certainly flown by, and I'm so grateful for the opportunity and environment I had to grow closer

to God, learn about His Church, and prepare for ministry. But that experience of education and formation is expensive. I would not be here as prepared as I am to be administrator without what I received. The money in this collection also goes to support our foreign priest program (without which we would not have Fr. Julius and his brother foreign priests to help us!) Without this fund we cannot properly support our clergy and without our clergy we will struggle to ensure that everyone has access to God's sacramental grace when they need it.

BTW, you may have gotten multiple envelopes for this one – one in the mail and one in your packet. It doesn't matter which one you use – it will all go to the same place.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

Last week I attended our local weekly St. Vincent de Paul meeting, where our faithful ministerial team assessed and discussed anyone and everyone who called or came to us for assistance. I am impressed with their dedication to helping the poor in our area the right way. Christian charity goes beyond simply throwing money at someone to solve their problem or make them go away. Our team does it the right way – they truly care about people who come; they take the time to get to know the situation; they work with them despite the difficulties involved; and they do their best to detect scams so that the money entrusted to them does not go to waste. Jesus says "You will always have the poor." Therefore, we must always be ready to help and this wonderful ministry ensures that we are. PARISH MAINTENANCE/IMPROVEMENT

In the last two weeks, I learned quickly how much we have to maintain in our parishes. We lost an air conditioning compressor in IC church, we needed electrical work done on St. Rita's walk-in freezer, a generator at St. Al's went down, and a computer at the parish office needed to be replaced. These sorts of things should come as no surprise to anyone who has their own household (first time for me!). You know that there's only so much we can do to prepare for the unexpected. That's what this fund is for – to help with those unexpected and unpleasant surprises that pop up now and then.
